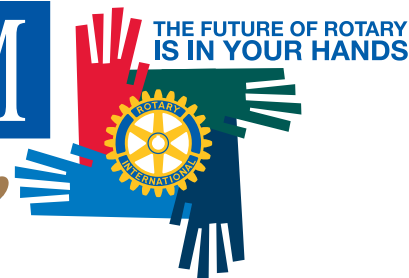

She heard former OSU Coach Earl Bruce say that his greatest accomplishment was earning the Big 10 Championship ring because it was something you couldn't do on your own. Beth could relate as she also has a Big 10 Championship ring. "It is so rewarding to be part of something bigger than yourself."

The 2009-10 Lady Buckeyes are ranked 3rd in the pre-season polls.
