Voting was conducted by paper ballot. Later in the meeting, Gary announced Chuck Moore had been selected.

### **Program:**

Tom Marcelain introduced Bill Bullard, state wildlife officer for Licking County.

Bill explained his duties are split between law enforcement of wildlife regulations and wildlife management, including wildlife education, hunter education and even archery in schools.

For wildlife management, he often obtains data

on wildlife for ODNR researchers including wild turkey surveys (listening for gobbles). Data allows biologists to crunch data and make decisions on how to manage wildlife.

Ohio's deer population is a topic 365 days per year. And while playing Augusta may be the ultimate dream of golfers, hunting in Licking County is equal to hunters. People travel here and pay money to hunt deer, he said.

His job is to help maintain health of deer and reduce population in urban areas. Hunting seems to work well and is a safe activity most of the time. One challenge is hunters prefer bucks to reproducing does and many hunters stop for the season after bagging a buck. Only 10 percent of hunters kill more than 2 deer.

Bill is also monitoring eagles' nests, including a possible new one near Raccoon International Golf Course on the north side of Ohio 161. There's also a nest on County Road 668.

ODNR is concerned about increased phosphates in Lake Erie and the recent toxic algae in Grand Lake St. Mary's in western Ohio. But he noted not all blue-green algae are bad for people. Chronic wasting disease (mad cow in deer) has not been found in Ohio.

On the topic of dangerous wild animals, he knows of 20-30 big cats in Licking County, but does not have jurisdiction for non-native animals. Most of their owners are sensible people.

In response to questions, Bill said:

- Turkey population is doing well in Ohio.
- Outfitters leasing land for hunting rights is making it tougher for kids to get hunting areas.
- Coyote population seems to be increasing. More people are asking him about them.
