This week's meeting: Mr. Tom Stewart



Tom Stewart serves as the executive vice president of the Ohio Oil and Gas Association (OOGA), having been elected to that position in September 1991. At OOGA, Stewart is director of staff; editor of the Association's publications; an industry spokesman to media

outlets and other forums; and, on behalf of OOGA members' interests, serves as public policy advocate in Columbus and Washington D.C.

Stewart serves as the Ohio associate representative to the Interstate Oil and Natural Gas Compact Commission (IOGCC), having been appointed to that position by Governor George Voinovich in 1997. IOGCC is an organization of governors of the oil and natural gas producing states established to promote the conservation and efficient recovery of domestic oil and natural gas resources while protecting health, safety and the environment.

Stewart is an active participant with the Independent Petroleum Association of America (IPAA) and serves on the IPAA Environment and Safety Committee, the Communications Steering Committee, the Gas Pipeline Safety Sub-Committee and is an original member of the management team organizing the national BRIEF Project (<http://www.energyindepth.org/>).

The Ohio Oil & Gas Association is a statewide trade association with over 1,750 members who are actively involved in the exploration, development and production of crude oil and natural gas within the State of Ohio. Since 1947, the Association's mission is to protect, promote, foster and advance the common interests of those engaged in all aspects of the Ohio crude oil and natural gas exploration and production industry.

of February at the Cherry Valley Lodge. The speaker will be Ohio Supreme Court Justice, Maureen O'Connor. There will be a sign-up sheet at the tables beginning next week.

If you read your Rotarian magazine you will know that India has been polio free for a year. Rotary International has spent over a **billion** dollars in this worldwide effort.

Our Sergeant-at-Arms, **Pat Jeffries**, levied fines on **Gary Baker, Dan Delawder, Charlie Nobel, Chris Meyer, Tom Hall**, and all doctors, lawyers or those related to a doctor or lawyer.

Tom Marcelain introduced our speaker, Dr. Kevin J. Edward. His topic was determining a person's competency to stand trial. The goal of a forensic psychological evaluation is to provide information for the court to assure that criminal proceedings can proceed. The most common evaluations determine "competency to stand trial" and "not guilty by reason of insanity." The competency evaluation determines whether the defendant understands the nature and objectives of the legal and whether they have the ability to assist their attorney in their defense. The "not guilty by reason of insanity" evaluation determines if the person had the ability, at the time of the crime, to know they were doing something illegal.

Many defendants go to great lengths to try to fool the examiner. This is called malingering. Both nationally and in Ohio, fewer than 15% who plead insanity are found not guilty by reason of insanity. Ohio has a rather strict definition of NGRI and it is seldom successful. Actually, very few insane people commit crimes.

There are criteria used to determine mental illness. These are clinical judgment, consistency, functional abilities and testing. In the clinical evaluation, things like eye contact, demeanor and clarity of the subject's description of symptoms is considered. People with genuine mental illness have no trouble defining the fear and the suffering they go through. Consistency is another thing they look for. The defendant has to present a symptom picture that matches what is known about the particular mental illness. It is also helpful if there is a record of treatment for their mental illness. The third thing that is evaluated is functional ability. Mental illness usually negatively affects the ability to perform daily activities..
