In addition, there are eleven members who are missing just one or two attendance credits short of "perfection". Don't take those easy "detours" off the road to good attendance. Remember, Rotary as a "participation" organization where everyone is expected to take an active role in the Club and its activities.

#### Program:

**Pat Jeffries** introduced our speaker, Lori Carlson who is the president of the Licking County Humane Society.

Lori pointed out that Glenn Abel was one of the community leaders involved with starting the Humane Society. They are a public, 501c3 charity which operates off of donations and fund-raising projects.

There are also memberships for \$25 individual and \$30 for a family membership. They are located next to the county dog pound but they are not associated with them. They house 10 to 14 dogs and about 20 cats, all between 1 and about 4 years old. One of the goals for this year is to kick off a capital campaign to build or renovate a building which will better meet their needs. They hope to be able to house

40 dogs and 50 cats.

They are looking at a number of prospective locations. They have to consider water and sewer availability because, with that many animals, they use a lot of both. They also need something that is centrally located. They are currently looking at a site on Thornwood Drive. There is another Humane Society in Johnstown and there are several rescue groups in the Newark area. Many boarding facilities also rescue pets.

This past year they had between 100 and 150 pets adopted, which doubled the number of adoptions from the year before. Animals come into the Humane Society from either owner surrender, which is on the increase during these tough economic times, or animals which are rescued from abusive situations or have been neglected abandoned. Although they normally only take in dogs and cats, this past year they have had bunnies, goats and a pig. There is no limit to the time an animal can stay at the shelter. They stay until they are adopted.

They have two full time employees and 4 part time employees. They are open every day but Wednesday and have evening hours on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. If they have room, they take animals from the pound that they think are good candidates for adoption with priority given to those which are closest to being euthanized.

There are several fund-raising events throughout the year. In the summertime, there is a rib-fest and in the fall last year they did "petpalozza" at the Granville Park. They had vets and pet related vendors come in with demonstrations and a 5K race. They have also had a Bowl-a-Thon. They are looking for somebody who is willing to organize a "Fur Ball" (dance ... I hope) Besides cash, the donations they need most is scoopable Kitty Litter, bleach, any cleaning supplies, pet toys, and bones for their dogs (not rawhide). Kroger donates dog food which they then donate to the open food pantry.

Community Humane Societies are **not** associated with, or tied to "The Humane Society of the United States" in any way. The same is true with the National ASPCA.

They are just starting to get a fostering program off the ground. Now that they have a humane agent, they are getting more animals that need some individual attention for a while.
