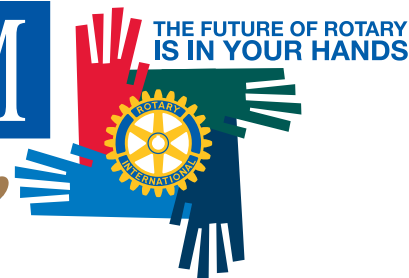

"The Ancient Ohio Trail" is a new partnership formed to promote cultural heritage tourism visits to Ohio's world-renowned but under-appreciated Native American earthwork sites, via print and multimedia materials, and special events, to help visitors to central and southern Ohio get the most out of their visits to the sites and the region. John E. Hancock holds professional architecture degrees from the University of Nebraska and McGill University, and has taught architectural design, theory, and history at the University of Cincinnati since 1978. His articles on architectural history and interpretation have been published internationally; his media productions and exhibits on ancient architecture and landscapes (especially the Ohio Earthworks, over the past decade) have been honored widely; and his former students have assumed leadership positions in architectural education throughout the world.

Pat concluded with this story: A congressman was at a rural elementary school talking to the children about some the issues that Congress deals with. When he

got to the subject of gun control he told the youngsters to be very quiet. Then he started clapping his hands about every two seconds. Once all the kids were focusing on that he was doing he said, "Each time I clap my hands, gun violence kills a child in the United States." A young boy in the front row jumped up and yelled, "Stop clapping you idiot!"

## Program:

**Susan Fryer** introduced our speakers, Sandra Heusinkveld and Karen Carver who are with an organization called Chatter Buddies. Too many young children are not learning to read. Starting with the belief that the actual problem is not being addressed. Reading does not start with letters. It starts with auditory input and many children do not get those inputs, such as reading and interacting with others. A child who interacts with his parents and gets read to a night will start kindergarten with a vocabulary of 20,000 words. If those things do not happen, the vocabulary will only be 5,000 words and the child will understand only about one forth of the teacher's words. By the time a child is 5 years old 90% of his communication system is formed -- for life! A study found that 60% of impoverished families do not have one book in the house - not even a phone book.

Chatter Buddies is developing a children's television show for public television, targeted to three and four year olds, that provides that auditory foundation to reading and writing. They produced a three minute segment and tested it in a Head Start classroom to see if the children would watch it and if the concept would work. The children watched it intently and the results were very positive. The segment focused on making the "R" sound and several children, after watching Chatter buddies for the first time were able to correctly pronounce words like "rag" for the first time. One parent said that he was planning on taking his child to a speech therapist and now he may not have to.

They are now going to produce a pilot show for PBS.
