Past District Governor Bob McGaughey facilitated a Paul Harris Fellow presentation to **Tony Adams**. His wife, Rita, pinned the distinguished Paul Harris pin on his lapel. The Adams made their \$1,000 Rotary International gift to support the bus project.



Sergeant-at-Arms

Much money was made for the scholarship fund by Sergeant-at-Arms **Pat Jeffries**. Accolades went to **Tom Slater** for his songwriting, **Don Gunnerson** for his selection as the 2011 Grand Illusions honoree and to **Dan DeLawder** for the Helping Hands Award he received at the Martin Luther King breakfast. A \$1 slap on the hand went to **Hugh Price** for misspelling **Amy and Jim Matesich's** last name on a direct mail piece. **Judy Pierce** was fined a buck for being re-named to the Governing Committee of the Licking County Foundation. (There were a few absent members who will need to pay up later.) **Ed Bohren** was fined for being appointed as a commissioner for the Licking Park

District. The most cash was generated, however, when **Sgt. Pat** fined "anyone who planned on having a birthday this year."

Program:

John Carlson introduced the speaker, Charles "Chuck" Carlson, who spoke on *Ephemerality*. Chuck has been a Rotarian since 1960 and is a Paul Harris Fellow. He's belonged to three Rotary Clubs and is a past president. Chuck retired from full-time teaching and administration in 1990 and was named Professor Emeritus of Interpersonal Communication by The Ohio University Board of Trustees.

While ephemerality means to only last for a short time, Chuck shared that some historical writers have created impressionable passages or found unique writing methods that have caused their works to transcend time.

Appropriate to the week, Chuck began his talk by reciting an excerpt from Martin Luther King's "I Have a Dream" speech. He noted that the speech was delivered in front of the Lincoln Memorial on August 28, 1963 before a planned march on Washington for jobs and freedom. While he could recall the specific details surrounding the famous leader's speech, he questioned if most could. "We remember more the words than the occasion," he said, noting that it was the repetition of words that etched the "I Have a Dream" speech into the memory banks of Americans.

With Chuck's lifelong interest in history, rhetoric and public address, he went on to share a memorable quote from Abraham Lincoln's famous Gettysburg Address. While some may not remember the speech was delivered at the dedication of the National Cemetery in Gettysburg, PA, they are highly likely to recall the first words of the address, which were simply a date: "Four score and seven years ago." Chuck said the treatment of time in this fashion was first used in the Book of Psalms in the Bible.

"Short lived is a relative not an absolute term," Chuck relayed using Albert Einstein's sentiments. "We write to try and savor a moment," he added.

Chuck shared poems, such as *The Acquisition and Patience*, from John Ellis' book titled "Connections: Poems of Daily Life" to further illustrate his point that the most common circumstances can be made memorable through the artistic use of words. The need to write "comes to us from a force that says *life is precious*," he said.
