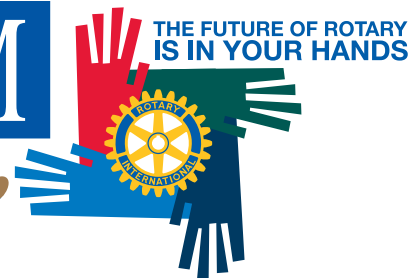

Program:

President **Nelson McCray** introduced today's speaker, Dr. Lew Mollica. Dr. Mollica, originally from Mansfield Ohio, has degrees from Defiance College, Bowling Green State University, and The Ohio State University. Dr. Mollica's professional career as an educator is extensive. He is the former Superintendent of Granville Schools and the Licking County Board of Education. In addition he is a former professor and consultant with the Ohio Department of Education. Dr. Mollica is a long-time member of the Granville Rotary club.

In his role as Community Impact Coordinator for the Community Mental Health and Recovery Board, Dr. Mollica oversees Our Futures in Licking County, a project to reduce substance use among youth and adults. A grant from SAMSHA, the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration) flows through the local Children and Family First Council to the Community Mental Health and Recovery Board and is key to funding this project, which also receives financial support from Licking County United Way and our local Community Mental Health and Recovery Board.

Our Futures in Licking County seeks to reduce substance abuse by changing community behaviors and attitudes, strengthening community collaboration, and increasing protective factors for youth. The project is provided oversight by a Leadership Board made up of local leaders. An Operations Committee oversees the implementation of project activities. The project relies on the implementation of activities that are evidence based (scientifically proven), low cost, simple and easy to implement.

- Seven out of eleven of the school districts in Licking County used the nationally normed Pride survey to assess the use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs by 6th, 8th, 10th and 12th graders. Over 5,000 Licking County students were surveyed. Key findings based on the survey data are:
- The use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs by Licking County youth appears to be higher than the national average;
- Alcohol is the most commonly used drug;
- Alcohol, tobacco and marijuana appear to be readily available for high school students;
- Parental monitoring and supervision drops considerably at the high school level, and many older students report that adults provide them with alcohol;
- Compared to the national sample, Licking County youth appear to have easier access to alcohol, tobacco and other drugs and less parental disapproval of alcohol and tobacco
- Almost one-third of Licking County 10th and 12th graders said an adult had provided them with alcohol during the past 30 days;
- Most students say they use alcohol and marijuana in their own homes or the home of a friend. Few use at school;
- Licking County students were less likely than the national sample to report being involved in sports, school activities, community activities, or church activities;
- Licking County 10th and 12th graders were more likely than the national sample to report that their parents "never" or "seldom" set clear rules.
