## **This week's Meeting: Licking County Humane Society - Lori Carlson**

Lori Carlson is the President of the Licking County Humane Society. She became involved with LCHS three years ago when her daughter needed to do some volunteer work for her college resume. They walked dogs every Sunday for 2 years and she was invited to join the board 1 ½ years ago.

One thing led to another and before she knew it, her daughter had left for college and she was the board president for LCHS. Until recently, she wrote the weekly articles in The Advocate entitled Furry Friend. She manages the LCHS sponsorship program and is co-chair for the upcoming Sept 4<sup>th</sup> fundraising event, Pet-A-Palooza. Earlier this year, she helped LCHS secure the humane agent responsibilities for Licking County and led the effort to contract with Phoenix Consulting of Johnstown to plan and manage a Capital Campaign for LCHS. She is thrilled to be leading LCHS on a path to building a new shelter.

Lori grew up in the Lancaster area but has lived in Licking County for almost 20 years. She graduated from Wittenberg University with a BS in psychology / biology and from Keller Graduate School of Management with a Master's in Public Administration. Her real job is as a social work supervisor for Licking County Children Services, where she has worked for 23 years. She was a special needs adoption worker from 1987-2000. Since 2000, she has been supervising social workers who manage child abuse/neglect cases. Her children tease that she's saving kids during the week and dogs/cats on the weekends.

She is married to Dennis, a psychiatric nurse on a children's unit at Ohio State. Her children both graduated from Heath and attended/are attending Ohio State. She has three dogs who were rescued from various places. Her goal is to make a difference in my community and to provide assistance and support to people and animals in need.

### **Last Week's Meeting**

Past President **Tom Slater** led the club in R-O-T-A-R-Y. **Richard Reed** led the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Past President **Tom Slater** led the club in "Blow Out All Your Candles" to recognize December birthdays. Then we sang "Going to the Columbus Zoo" which was sung to the tune of "The Bear Went Over the Mountain."

President Elect **Gary Baker** introduced the many guests by going to each table and having club members introduce their own guests. We had a total of 48 guests!

**Sergeant-At-Arms:** Past President **Pat Jeffries** fined the following club members. He asked who was under the age of 30 and had received a puppy for Christmas. The lucky person was Jeb Quackenbush, so **Barb Quackenbush** was fined. Then Pat asked Jeb who his favorite teacher was, he didn't have a response so Barb was fined again since his teacher is Pat's daughter.

### **Program:**

The guest who had traveled the furthest came from San Diego, Calif., and was visiting **Herb Odle** so Herb was fined. **Jerry Nethers** was fined for having the most number of guests. Pat then called on anyone in the club who had not been fined by name in the previous year.

To close he asked anyone who had played basket ball on a organized team to stand, then asked those individuals to sit who had not played at Newark HS, and then anyone to sit who had not worn jersey #13. Jerry Nethers was left standing, but Pat was trying to catch **Gus Pryor**. Gus denied winning an award and wearing jersey #13, so Pat pulled a photo from the Newark HS athletic department to prove Gus was wrong. Gus was fined \$3.

**Ron Fuller** introduced the program speakers, Keith Hornsby and Tiffany Will. They are both members of the animal promotions team at the Columbus Zoo. After providing a brief history of the Columbus Zoo and

the animal promotions team, they introduced several animals.

Charlotte, a six-month-old kangaroo, was carried throughout the crowd in a sling. She was drinking milk from a bottle. Keith shared that she is in the final stages of milk consumption drinking the richest milk. There are four types of kangaroo milk which become richer as the kangaroo gets older. He identified the predators for kangaroos, Tasmanian Devil and the Dingo.

The next animal was a red roof lemur named Madagascar. The predator for this animal is the Fossa (mongoose family). It was carried in while munching on a banana snack. Keith explained the difference between a monkey and an ape; monkeys have tails and apes do not.

The third animal was a 3-banded armadillo. The female named Bonita ran around the room sneaking under tables. This animal is related to the anteater family and to the sloth. There are no predators for this animal. It is the size of a golf ball at birth and the females only have one at a time. The 9-banded armadillo have 4 babies at a time.

Marlin, a 3-month-old South African Penguin, ran into the room following Tiffany, the trainer. Keith explained that there are more tropical penguins in the world and that all penguins live in the southern hemisphere. An interesting note was that you would never find a penguin and a polar bear together in nature.

The final animal was Maggie, a Fraser Island Dingo. She will be six years old in February. While she looked like a lovely pet, greeting Rotarians like a common dog Keith reminded the group that she is a wild animal and that she would not make a good pet. She howls and whines throughout the night. Keith closed by sharing that once animals go on exhibit they are no longer used for education.
