Student guests were also introduced. Host Rotarian **Stephen Fowler** introduced Watkins Memorial High School principal Steve Donahue and read the bios of students Haley G. Williams and Mike Taylor. Host Rotarian **Tony Adams** introduced Lakewood High School principal Larry Bevard and students Nicole Kennedy and Brian Lange.

Ryan Mills of the Granville Rotary Club spoke of the club's rose sale. Roses sell for \$20 per dozen and can be purchased for delivery on Sweetest Day (Oct. 17) or other holidays in the year.

Newark City Schools' officials were fined for the 30th year of the marching band's recognition in competition. Lastly, **Cara Riddle** was fined for an ambitious goal of running half-marathons in half of

the states, including an upcoming one in Connecticut.

Sergeant Pat auctioned off **Cara Riddle's** reportedly self-portrait, carved pumpkin with a \$45 winning bid to **Erin Kennedy**.

Program:

President Nelson introduced Tom Carlisi, District 6690 Chair for Rotaract and a member of the Columbus Rotary Club. He also introduced Chris Shulby, past president of the OSU main campus Rotaract Club and past youth exchange student, who is a school teacher in Coshocton.

Carlisi led off his remarks with background on Rotary International's Rotaract clubs. These clubs are for 18-30 year olds with a college and/or young professionals focus. Along a theme that "Rotary needs to get younger," Rotaracts combined with Interact (high school) clubs gives one an opportunity to serve their community through Rotary at every stage of life.

The goals are to help young people get involved, develop leadership skills, and build fellowship. There are already Rotaract clubs in District 6690 at Otterbein, Athens, St. Clairsville, and OSU.

Shulby gave a *PowerPoint* presentation on his OSU Rotaract club experience. OSU was started with 15 grad students, dropped to just two people at the start of Year 2, but re-grew. The club, with a structure similar to a typical Rotary club, undertook fundraisers (including a "speed dating" event), conducted local projects (a winter garden in a poor neighborhood), and met with local business leaders. The club's website address is <http://rotaract.org.ohio-state.edu/>.

Carlisi talked about future plans. District 6690 hopes to double to eight clubs this year by adding Rotaract clubs in Westerville, Columbus State, Marietta College, and OSU-Newark/COTC. **Bill McDonald** is the faculty liaison for the OSU-N/COTC proposed club which is being jointly sponsored by the Rotary clubs of Granville, Pataskala, Newark-Heath, and Newark.

Bill reports up to 48 potential students interested in the club. Carlisi predicts this number should at least yield the minimum 15 actual members required to charter a club. The speakers encouraged Newark Rotarians to suggest possible Rotaract club membership to young people.
