This week's program: Doctor Icky Nicky

Longtime Newark doctor Nicholas E. Reed or "Doctor Icky Nicky" will be returning to town to address the club on how humor therapy in the form of clowning can benefit patient care. After 35 years as an OB/GYN in Newark, Reed retired in 2007 and moved to Lake Placid, Fla., where he took up clowning and graduated from Toby's Clown School in 2008. He routinely visits nursing homes and "clown arounds" in his Florida town.

"The practice of medicine is much more than science and technology. We must never forget that it is even more of an art and deal with the emotional and spiritual aspects of the healing process. It is this union of the 'art of medicine' and the scientific and technological advances that result in the total healing picture," he wrote.

The doctor graduated from Miami University and The Ohio State University before beginning his work here. He performed 12,000 deliveries and 10,000 surgeries in his years at a private practice. He founded Moundview OB-GYN in 1995. He's been married to Nancy for 45 years and has three sons, a medical doctor in Tennessee and Boston plus a local attorney with Reese, Pyle, Drake and Meyer. He received the Red Nose Clown Award in 2010 and first in the nation at the 25th Silver Anniversary of the Clowns of American International competition. He's also a member of the Lake Placing morning Rotary.

Announcements:

Jane Simmons gave an update on the Rotary Auction set for October 30 in Adena Hall. Rotarians should be getting invitations in the mail. Chances are being sold for the wine hutch and list of auction items is building.

President Jeff said cards were being circulated for **Charlie Lawrence** and **Phil Shannon**.

Tom Mullady revealed that September saw a 86.9% attendance rate, though to be a probable all-time record. The 2009 rate was 66.3%. 50 Rotarians saw perfect attendance in the first quarter.

Bernadette Collins exchanged a red badge for blue with sponsor **Tom Slater** doing the honors.

Later, **Sgt. Pat** mentioned he would be auctioning off tickets next week. The Oct. 23 OSU vs. Purdue tickets as well as two tickets to the Oct. 22 Pink Floyd concert, including a ride to/from the concert with **Steve Layman**.

Program:

Bernadette Collins introduced the speaker, Debra Saffo, coordinator of Tech Prep and Central Ohio Technical College. Saffo also serves as Assistant Director of the Tech Prep Consortium and is a retired teacher from Columbus City Schools.

The program, which included a PowerPoint presentation, was focused on explaining the Ohio College Tech Prep and collaborative initiatives. Tech Prep is a program of study for high school students primarily in 11th and 12th grade to transition them to higher education and the work force. The mission of College Tech Prep is to prepare for technical skills with an emphasis on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) careers.

The speaker added that business partners are an element of the program. The program encompasses 16 different career fields which, within them, include a wide variety of career pathways. The typical student has a program of study from ninth grade to associate degree.

Participation is first a school district's decision to participate in the consortium then the students' decision to take part in the program offered. The "Heart of Ohio" Tech Prep is an eight-county consortium of which Licking County is one. It was noted that all Licking County students have an opportunity to participate in College Tech Prep.

The value proposition for students is access to scholarships, the need to take fewer college courses by taking college credit early, industry-recognized certifications, and early exposure to the field of study to help clarify a student's career direction. There are also benefits to the high schools and to the community.
