### Program:

In just five weeks, Past President Michele Layman will celebrate a significant milestone. She will officially become a breast cancer survivor.

Having lost her mother to breast cancer and having battled the disease herself, Michele had all the motivation necessary to take on *Walking for the Cure*. However, she quickly found it took more than motivation to conquer the three-day, 60-mile walk. It took a lot of hard training and the support of two very close friends, Storm and Michele, to ultimately get her across the finish line.

*Walking for the Cure* takes place in 15 cities across the country each year to benefit the *Susan G. Komen for the Cure*, the largest foundation in support of breast cancer research. In 2008, the Komen fund donated an unprecedented \$100 million to scientific research, and issued \$193 million in grants for education programs, awareness activities, prevention screenings and treatment.

On the morning of October 17, 2008 in a small town outside of Philadelphia, Michele took her first step of the journey. Drove of well-wishers lined the path, providing the 3100 walkers with snacks, drinks and loads of support. "You could walk 60 miles and gain 20 pounds," Michele remarked about the amount of food.

At night, Michele and fellow walkers would camp out in pink pup tents that formed a sea of "Pink Palaces." It was here at the campground that the walkers would share their personal stories about breast cancer.

Michele was often asked during her training why the walk was 60 miles. On day three, she knew. The physical, mental and emotional challenge of the journey mirrored the tough battle anyone with breast cancer goes through, she said.
