Ron shared with the Club how much he has enjoyed his work with Rotary but especially the Rotary Foundation as the decisions made at the Foundation reflect back on the Rotarians. He talked about polio and the fact that this is the No. 1 priority for the Foundation. He explained that there will not be another corporate project until polio is eradicated. Ron provided an update on the \$200 million matching campaign. \$100,857,000 has been raised to date.

Ron provided information on the Annual Programs Fund and also the Permanent Fund which is currently worth \$597 million. He discussed the benefits of making a planned gift.

Ron discussed the future vision plan and the six areas of focus as presented by the Rotary President. He explained the purpose of the Vision Plan. There are 100 pilot districts that were selected for the training program out of 277 that applied.
