Program:

Susan Fryer introduced our speaker, **Sarah Wallace** who serves on multiple boards and is currently serving as chairperson to "A Call to College".

Before beginning her presentation Sarah Wallace announced that **Bill McConnell** will be receiving the Ohio Banker's Award.

Ms. Wallace explained that Call to College is a college

access program with the objective to make sure every single qualified Newark student has access to post-secondary programs.

The framework is on Newark students. The number of free and reduced lunch eligible students is increasing. Newark High School's graduation rate is seeing an upward trend.

A Call to College provides several programs reaching different grade levels. The senior program is the original program which Jane McConnell designed and for which endowments were developed. This program provided one-on-one advising to seniors through a volunteer program.

The "Last Dollar Grant" program is a "needs-based" grant for up to \$1,000 up to four years and serves as the impetus to get students to get signed-up for A Call to College. This program also provides volunteers to work with families to complete FAFSA.

The Junior Program began about three years ago and is centered on helping students to think about pursuing appropriate education. ACT test preparation and transportation to the ACT test site are included in this program. Tested students have increased from 7 students the first year to 147 this year.

PEAK Program – provides early awareness and knowledge. Janet Schultz is instrumental in this program which involves a five-way partnership between OSU-N, COTC, Denison, Newark City Schools and A Call to College. PEAK serves elementary and middle school grades. The second-grade program focuses on reading and age appropriate vocabulary, and on the message that "you can go to college, but first you must graduate from high school". The eighth-grade PEAK program focuses on career awareness, college exploration, and connection current and home school classes to college goals "the more you learn, the more you earn".

This year A Call to College is starting PEAK at the fourth grade level which will focus on financial literacy and reinforce college-going behavior.

Results: for every dollar provided, they get \$13 from other sources and there is 95% of freshman to sophomore retention in college.

A Call to College is growing and by next year will have presence in second, fourth, sixth, eighth, eleventh and twelfth grades.

Under Diane DeLawder's leadership, Staff of Ohio College Access Network nominated the Call to College for the Thomas L. Coughlin Award which is celebrating its twentieth year in September, 2011.

The importance of A Call to College is that it is an endowment driven organization and true partnership. This organization relies heavily on volunteers to help students. A Call to College...what can I do? Members were asked to provide reunion class information, and that "class gifts" from "reunioning" classes would be helpful. A Call to College provides volunteer opportunities – everything you can do in Newark Schools is helpful

Jennifer Utrevis was the raffle winner.
