It will open in December and expand greatly from the current 18 beds. There are three wings for women, families and men and large common area complete with six washers and dryers. Those who stay at the shelter can live there for up to 90 days and are afforded a range of services to assist them in finding work and transition back into their own housing through the Licking County Coalition for Housing.
