This week's meeting: Professor Randall Buchman, Defiance College

Randall Buchman is Distinguished Professor Emeritus of History at Defiance College and City Historian, City of Defiance. He specializes in Ohio Valley American Indian studies, and has worked at prehistoric sites in Ohio and Indiana. He recently taught Native American History at Bacone College and Indian College in Oklahoma.



Ohio's Role in the Choice of Lincoln

The people of Ohio played a significant and largely overlooked role in Lincoln's rise to the White House, including the competition in his own party from Ohio Governor Salmon P. Chase. Buchman discusses Ohio connections to Lincoln's nomination, ranging from the Mansfield News hoax to Ohioans who were involved in his Cooper Union Speech to the Ohio delegation that put Lincoln's nomination over the top at the national convention in Chicago.
