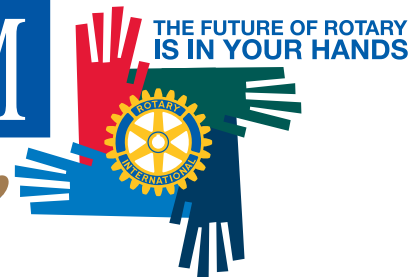

Program:
