Licking Memorial Hospital Division Chief of Cardiology Bryce I. Morrice, M.D., earned his Medical Degree from the University of Cincinnati (Ohio) College of Medicine after receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry from Antioch College in Yellow Springs, Ohio. He completed his internal medicine internship and residency with Cedars-Sinai Medical Center and a cardiology fellowship with Wadsworth VA Medical Center, all in Los Angeles, California. He is board certified in internal medicine and cardiovascular diseases.



In 1994, the Licking County chapter of the American Heart Association established the Bryce Morrice Award to be presented in future years for outstanding service to the community for cardiovascular care. In 2001, the Granville resident was selected by his peers as a co-recipient of the LMH Physician of the Year award and was also named Hospice of Central Ohio Physician of the Year.

Dr. Morrice has served on the boards of the Central Ohio and Licking County chapters of the American Heart Association, Moundbuilders Professional Association, and Hospice. He has served as medical director of the Newark EMS Board, is past president of the American Heart Association Ohio-West Virginia Affiliate, and is a fellow of the American College of Cardiology

The Newark Rotary Club gathered Dec. 6 for a 95th Anniversary celebration with many Rotarians, their spouses and honored guests joining the celebration at Moundbuilders Country Club.

As we enjoyed dinner, Shawna Corder's music students performed holiday songs.

Past president **Tom Slater** led us in singing R-O-T-A-R-Y with wife, Joyce, on the piano.



We held a moment of silence for **Bob Baldwin** and **Charlie Manning** along with other Rotarians who have served the club during its history. Both died Dec. 1.

Past District Governor **Bob McGaughy** led the invocation.

We sang "White Christmas."

President **Gary Baker** recognized past district governors present and asked past club presidents to stand.

Pat Jeffries spoke about the history of the club since the first meetings in the Newark Arcade in 1916. He noted Camp Enterprise began in 1975 and is now up to 100 students per year. The auction began in 1982 and has now raised more than \$1 million. He also spoke about the \$800,000 playground.



"We all sit in the shade of trees that someone else planted," he said. "We need to keep doing that for others to follow us. We don't boast. We just do what we do because it's the right thing to do."

District Governor **Brent Rosenthal** congratulated the club.

Former President and District Governor **T.D. Griley** introduced the program and was honored for his service to our club and RI.
