Program: Rob Montagnese introduced **Dr. Bryce Morrice** and his accomplishments and honors as a cardiologist in our community. Dr. Morrice began his talk by explaining the title, "My Romance with Wine," which is dedicated to his late wife who knew a great deal about wine. Dr. Morrice also shared that there is more to wine than just to make you intoxicated. He also shared there are "wine geeks" all around. Throughout Dr. Morrice's talk, he compared two types of wine, red and white and explained the differences between the two along with the differences/history between the French grapes/wine and the California grapes/wine. Dr. Morrice shared detailed information about the development of each type of wine and the various costs of wine. He shared good wine ranges from \$12 to \$20,000, some of which can be purchased at Giant Eagle. As Dr. Morrice shared his stories and expertise on wine, one could understand his passion and excitement for a good glass of wine.
