Program:

"Being prepared for a disaster" presented by our local American Red Cross spokes person Tom Baldosser.

The American Red cross provides more than half of the nation's blood supply and provides disaster relief, on average, to approximately 600 families a day. It teaches safety education and Disaster education. Our local American Red Cross gets 20 percent of it funding though United Way, 25 percent through selling its own products, and 55 percent through fund drives.

The three courses of action The American Red Cross recommends in preparing for a disaster:

- Get a Kit
- Make a plan
- Be informed

Your kit should include things such as: water one gallon per person per day, a can opener, flash light, radio (extra batteries) prescriptions if needed, pet supplies (food) if needed, duct tape and plastic, sanitary supplies, minimum \$20.00 in cash and change, pre paid phone card, 1st aid kit, multi purpose tool, clothing and bedding, and important papers.

Have a plan; you should discuss with your family a course of action to take in case of an emergency. Discuss an escape rout, plan what to do if separated, how and where to meet up, and tell others of you plan.

Be informed listen to the radio for latest reports, talk to your neighbors.

If you come on to the scene of an emergency or accident; remember the 3 "Cs" of check, call and care; check the scene to make sure it is safe, call 911 or the appropriate emergency personnel, give care to the victim.

The bottom line is to be proactive before an emergency occurs.

Tom Baldosser encourages us to give blood, he said we can give blood every 56 days and he asked us to please volunteer to the American red cross they can use our help.
