Program:

Carolyn Fraker is Vice President of Compliance and Chief Privacy Officer at MedBen. Her bio appeared in last weeks' Rotogram. She spoke about the current state of Healthcare Reform and the potentially devastating effect it could have on the healthcare insurance industry, and on the country in general. The healthcare bill is 2,500 pages long and she has read 1,500. What we have, according to Carolyn, is a law that is illogical and is not working. Much of the bill centers on the elimination of lifetime and annual maximums, the inclusion of dependents until age 26 and removal of pre-existing conditions as a reason for declining insurance coverage.

In her words, not MedBen's, Carolyn stated that Healthcare Reform is designed to eliminate health care companies and employer sponsored plans between now and 2014.

She doesn't think the bill can be repealed. She REALLY knows her stuff!
