Gary was previously a Special Agent, with the Inspector General's Office/HUD, working criminal investigations in Columbus. In 1995, Gary was named Mid-Level Special Agent of the Year for his investigations in

drug and gun trafficking in "Operation Safe Home" which led to the arrests and convictions of over 200 illegal drug and gun dealers Gary previously served as Senior Instructor/Trainer for Department of Treasury Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC), Glynco, Georgia. He has trained over 5000 federal officers. Gary currently instructs and is one of the original developers of the "Undercover Operations Course" for the Inspector General Academy at FLETC, Glynco, Ga. held twice a year. Gary has consulted too many law enforcement agencies, magazines, periodicals, and book publications in the area of undercover operations, and use of force issues and has testified as an expert witness in state and federal courts.
