This week's Meeting: Michael Carey

Michael Carey of Granville, is the president of the American Council for Affordable and Reliable Energy, a Washington, D.C., based public policy organization that advocates a balanced approach on energy issues in order to protect and enhance our nation's economic and national security. The organization believes that these public policies should not arbitrarily or unfairly discriminate among energy sources and should be based on sound science and cost-effective and growth-promoting government regulation.

Mr. Carey is a much sought after voice on the national level on energy and climate change issues. He has testified before both houses of Congress, frequently speaks to political groups including the Tea Party, and regularly appears on talk radio, the Fox News Channel, and other media outlets. Mr. Carey has frequently criticized the Obama Administration's EPA restrictions on energy as a "war on coal" that will limit the prosperity and opportunity of average Americans.

Since 1999, Mr. Carey has served as the President of the Ohio Coal Association. As the state's chief advocate for Ohio's coal industry, he is responsible for representing its interests before Ohio's General Assembly. Mr. Carey directs the association's legislative agenda and develops media contacts in order to strengthen the voice of Ohio's coal industry.

Prior to joining the Ohio Coal Association, Mr. Carey served both as a staff member and as a volunteer for several state and federal officials, including in Congress. From 1989-1999, Mr. Carey served the United States as an officer with the United States Army Reserves. His education includes a Bachelor of Arts in History from The Ohio State University and Associate of Science Degree in Economics from the Marion Military Institute.

Mr. Carey resides in Granville, Ohio with his wife, Kristin, and their son Prescott.

Program

President Jeff then introduced Rotarian Dan DeLawder to introduce the day's speaker. **Dave Hile** is a member of our Club and is the Superintendent of the Licking Valley Schools. He graduated from Ashland College and received his

Superintendent's Certificate from Ohio University (much to Dan's delight!) He has served as the Superintendent since 2007. He is married to Angie and they have two boys.

Dave had the unique opportunity to participate in the China Exchange Initiative funded by the Freeman Foundation. He was accepted as one of 10 educators from Ohio and one of 40 nationwide. He was there for 17 days. Part of the experience was that a Chinese superintendent, Tianyuan Zhu, was allowed to participate and come to Ohio and spend a week with Dave and his family and visit in Dave's school. As he spoke no English, this was an interesting week made better by Denison University, who provided interpreters for the week.

What impressed the Chinese most about schools in America included such things as: value placed on student creativity and hands on skills; value on education and all the resources allocated to it; care for and attention to every child including the poor and kids with disabilities; teachers' dedication; fact that children have time to play at home as well as school; numbers of electives offered in high school and fact that students can go to college while in high school.

In China, the best students go to the best schools and go based on test scores. There are no school districts. Students pay part of the fee and there are few electives offered. Teachers are told by the government that they will be teachers and then are assigned to a school. As a teacher, they live at the school assigned. The biggest problem facing schools in China is there is not enough capacity for all students.

Dave viewed China as a land of many contrasts particularly between old and new; the rich and the poor. He visited Xi'an, which was an ancient walled city. He also visited a small town 20 miles outside which was very poor in comparison. The school was not heated and the students wore coats all day in an attempt to stay warm. Their tour guide had studied in Colorado after being told by the Chinese government that he was to be a tour guide (There seems to be a trend here.)

He then visited the National Day School in Beijing which was home to students K-12 and offered state of the art amenities. To be allowed to attend here was limited to the top 6% of students from all over China and live in dorms. It was a beautiful school and was heated.

He visited Wuhan and the home of Tianyuan Zhu and his school. It is a large dirty, industrial city and was filled with smog which made breathing difficult. The school houses 3300 students and because of the number, the teachers change rooms and the students stay in place. Although he was the superintendent, a representative of the Communist Party was actually in charge of the school. As their teachers are assigned by the government and it is a life time assignment, there is no real power to discipline them or fire them.

It was another great presentation by one of our own. Thank you Dave.
