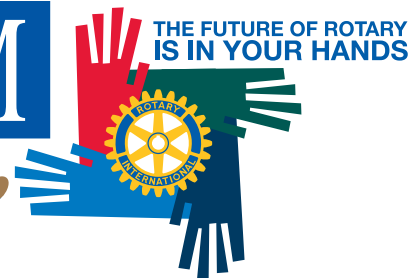

Program:

Susan Fryer introduced **Ted Wiseman**. (Bio was in last week's Rotogram)

Mr. Wiseman presented the group with information on the pork industry. Agriculture is the number one industry in Ohio and in Licking County. In the 1970s, people began to change their eating habits due to the amount of fat that was in their diets. In order to keep with this, the pork industry had to make some changes. They began a marketing campaign called "the other white meat" and pork became 16% leaner than it had been in the past.

The pork industry is very cautious and strict about disease control. They are regulated by the EPA and everything is computerized now. The economic impact that one large facility has on the community is:

- 21 new jobs
- 22 19 indirect jobs
- 23 \$1,000,000 in new income
- 24 \$27,000 in new property taxes
- 25 \$65,000 in new revenue for state
- 26 A third of all employees have college degrees

In 2008, the pork industry produced \$4.9 billion in export. And you cannot get H1N1 from eating pork. The U.S. has one of the safest food supplies in the world.
