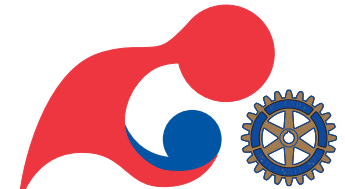

Today's Speaker: Archie Griffin



Archie Griffin is widely known as the only two-time winner of the prestigious Heisman Trophy, symbolic of "The Outstanding College Football Player of the Country." He was a three time All American in 1973, 1974 and 1975. He received many awards and recognitions during his college career. Graduating a quarter early from Ohio State, Griffin earned his degree in

Industrial Relations. In 1976, he was a first round draft choice of the Cincinnati Bengals, where he served as co-captain and played with the franchise for eight years.

He returned to his alma mater in March, 1984. He later accepted the position of Special Assistant to the Director of Athletics in June of 1985. In July of 1987, he was named Assistant Director of Athletics, and in April of 1994, named Associate Director of Athletics.

He has been a consistent supporter of the University throughout his career. Both on and off the field, Griffin has demonstrated the true meaning of being an Ohio State alumnus by being a community leader in Columbus and throughout the state. His accomplishments are well known, and his involvement with special interest groups and charities throughout Ohio and beyond has earned him respect and admiration that is well deserved.

Griffin created the Archie Griffin Scholarship Fund which benefits Ohio State's Olympic sports programs. He and his wife, Bonita, formed the Archie and Bonita Griffin Foundation Fund that helps develop sports, educational, and travel programs for youth in central Ohio. Archie is also a member of many charitable organizations, including the Columbus Foundation, Columbus Youth Foundation, Advisory Board for the ADA's Advocacy Leadership Council of the American Diabetes Association, serves as honorary co-chair for the 2006 Menu of Hope luncheon benefiting the Children's Hunger Alliance Endowment Fund, and also serves as honorary chair of the Diversity Enhancement Program for The James Cancer Hospital and Research Institute. Griffin became president and CEO of The Ohio State University Alumni Association on January 1, 2004.

He has three children—Anthony, Andre, and Adam.

Program: Ron Fuller introduced the speaker Jack Park. Jack graduated with a BS in accounting at Ohio State University and a MBA at the University of Pennsylvania. He worked for the Ohio News Network and The Fan radio station (now 97.1 FM).

Jack took us through his journey of more than 100 years of Buckeye Football. He shared with us four of Ohio State's all-time greatest victories.

October 11, 1952: Ohio State 23, No. 1 Wisconsin 14, in Columbus. Wisconsin invaded Ohio Stadium as the nation's top-ranked team but the Buckeyes won 23-14- This was the first time that OSU defeated a #1 team.

Oct. 12, 1968: No. 4 Ohio State.13, No 1 Purdue 0, in Columbus. This was one of Ohio State's all-time greatest victories as this set the stage for the national title.

Nov. 2, 1985: No. 8 Ohio State 22, No. 1. Iowa 15, In Columbus. Iowa was the first top-ranked opponent to appear in Ohio Stadium since Purdue in 1968. The Buckeyes, who owned the nation's longest home winning streak at 19 games, were an underdog in their own stadium for the first time in eight seasons. The Buckeyes were 14-point underdogs to the Hawkeyes. It ended up being Iowa's only loss of the season.

Jan. 3, 2003 (Fiesta Bowl): The Buckeyes accepted an invitation to play for the national title. Miami grabbed the other spot after defeating Syracuse and Virginia Tech the following two weekends, creating a showdown between the nation's only two undefeated teams. The Buckeye's won 31-24 to capture the National Championship and become the only major college team to record a 14-0 record.

In Jack's closing remarks he asked if we know of a young person in need of encouragement be sure to bring this person with you next week to hear Archie's special message. Jack reminded us that if you work hard at what you do and believe you can do it, you will succeed.
