Gary Wimer is Job Developer for Community Employment Services, a division of Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities. Wimer's primary duties include building relationships with local businesses and employers to secure work opportunities in the community for adults with developmental disabilities.

Following graduation from Heath High School, Wimer attended Bowling Green State University for two years. He was drafted during the Vietnam War, serving in the United States Air Force from 1970 to 1975. He later earned a Bachelor of Science degree in business management from The Ohio State University. He has owned and operated three businesses in central Ohio. For the past three years, he has worked as a Job Coach for Community Employment Services, supervising individuals with developmental disabilities at their places of employment. He also created a successful LICCO Lawn care venture. Wimer is immediate past president of the Heath Moundbuilders Kiwanis Club and is active in his church. He serves on the boards of education for Heath City Schools and C-TEC, where he is vice president. Wimer and his wife have a daughter, a son and two grandsons.

Brett McClintock is the Contract Procurement Specialist at LICCO Incorporated. He began his career with The Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities in 1980 as a Workshop Specialist. He managed LICCO's pallet manufacturing business from 1982 until 1994 when that business was sold. He served as a Staff Coordinator from 1994 until 1996 when he began in his current position. Brett lives in Newark, Ohio with his wife Stephanie, and daughter Emily. He also has a son, Andrew, who is a senior at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. Brett is a graduate of the 1994-95 Licking County Leadership class. He

currently serves on the Board of The Alliance of Ohio Work Centers and is a member of the Licking County "Workonomics" group.

Program

Mr. Carey discussed what the American Council for Affordable and Reliable Energy is and what it stands for. He went into the history the "war on coal" and what the bill called Cap & Trade would have meant to the consumer (higher cost of fuel across the board). President Obama has now recreated this and called it the CES, or Clean Energy Standard, which Mr. Carey says does about the same thing as Cap and Trade would have done.

Mr. Carey reported that Ohio gets 90% of its electricity from coal. We are the third largest coal-consuming state in the nation – using 68 million tons per year. In India, their growing economy is 250 million tons short on coal, so they are actively trying to get their hands on some. In his opinion, Ohio and the nation need to meet those coal needs in other countries. He said that unless we increase our reserves, the cost of oil and gas will continue to rise.
