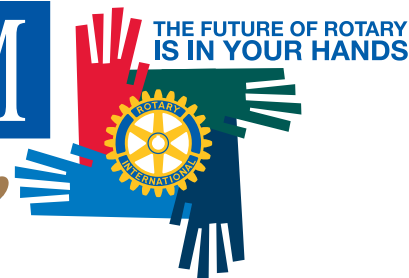

Program:

President Nelson introduced our speaker, Scott Halliday, who spoke to us about communications, where we are now, how did we get here and where are we headed in the future. AT&T has reported that land line use has dropped by 42% from 2000 to 2008 and is falling at an accelerating rate. When two people talk on a land line, they are physically connected by copper wires.

The introduction of the Internet allowed more kinds of information on this "highway of wires" ... not just sound but also pictures, text and much more. Today, much of the copper wiring has been replaced by glass fibers which allow a lot more information to pass through them at any one time. You can hardly watch TV without seeing a Vonage commercial. Vonage, Skype and others provide telephone service through the internet. (Eduardo called me on Monday from Brazil on Skype) Cell phones have also taken a large share of the land line market. One downside to this is that consumers have lowered their expectations. Dropped calls and poor reception are accepted. Another downside is the lack of security. Businesses which deal with sensitive information should not use Vonage or similar services because the risk of someone being able to listen to your conversations is much greater. It is much easier to hack into the Internet than to tap a phone line. Also, Vonage, Skype and the others have not adopted the international standards.

Looking to the future, faster computer chips will allow better service. While AT&T and Verizon are waging 3G wars through their TV adds, in Europe 4G networks are already in place. There is technology today that allows Internet signals to travel through the power line into your home which will by-pass the old "Ma Bell" copper lines and provide faster and better service.
