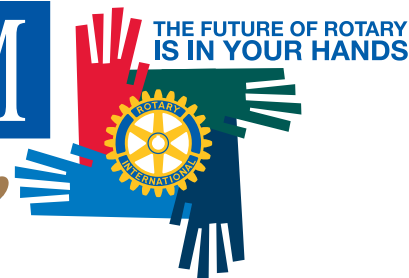

Program

The speaker was **Jonathon Downes**, husband of Rotarian **Marcia Downes**, who works as an attorney in Columbus. He's been a speaker at the Youth Ethics Conference hosted by our club the past two years and said he really enjoys the experience.

His speech focused on the following points.

- ? Ethics comes before excellence. How do we teach ethics? It's our responsibility to do so!
- ? All organizations need an ethics policy in writing. Companies with ethics policies get sued less, are more profitable and don't find themselves in the headlines in bad ways.
- ? Excuses are not a substitute for ethics. Problems don't require you to benefit personally. Ends don't justify means.

His pillars of ethics are: Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring, and Citizenship.

His definition of ethics:

- Express yourself
- Teach yourself
- Hold yourself, others responsible
- Inform yourself
- Create positive attitudes
- Support Others

He concluded by stating: "Good people don't tolerate bad behavior."

Tom Mullady announced all five Steering Committee recommendations had been approved.
