This week's Meeting: OSU Newark & COTC

Bill MacDonald and his wife, Ann, and their four children reside in Granville. Bill conducts research in the areas of family, religion, race, and social movements. His articles have appeared in the *Journal of Marriage and the Family*, the *Journal of Family Issues*, and the *Journal for the Scientific Study of Religion*. The National Science Foundation has funded his research on racial division over voluntary euthanasia, and in 1997 the Center for the Study of Religion and American Culture at IU-PUI-Indianapolis named him a Young Scholar in American Religion. He has won several awards, including one of the Templeton Foundation's prizes for courses on science and religion, the OSUN Award for Scholarly Achievement, the Barnes Award for Exemplary Teaching and the Accomplished Graduate Award from Bowling Green State University. Bill grew up in Norwalk, OH, and attended Bowling Green State University, where he earned his bachelor's degree, his master's degree, and his Ph.D. He came to OSU at Newark in 1992, and has since served in a variety of roles, including Honors Director, Assistant Academic Dean, and Academic Dean. He is now serving his second appointment as Dean/Director and was recently appointed as the Executive Dean of Regional Campuses.

Bonnie L. Coe, PhD, is originally from Gallipolis, Ohio. She received her bachelor and master's degrees from The Ohio State University and her doctoral degree from The University of Dayton. Dr. Coe has done post doctoral work at Indiana University. She has also participated in the Harvard Institute for Educational Management and Harvard Seminar for New Presidents. Dr. Coe's work experience varies with training & development at a number of hospitals in Ohio, high school teacher, high school principal, research and consultation work, Interim Director & Co-Principal Investigator at Sinclair Community College, Vice President & Dean of Faculty at Central Ohio Technical College. In May, 2004, she was appointed President of Central Ohio Technical College. Some of the boards Dr. Coe sits on include: The Board of Directors for The Works Ohio Center for History, Art & Technology; Kendall at Granville and First Federal Savings and Loan. She is also very active in the Newark Rotary group. Dr. Coe and her husband Larry reside in Newark and are the proud parents of seven children.

Program

Rotarian Nancy Neely introduced the program on LICCO by reminding us March is Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month.

Brett McClintock is the Contract Procurement Specialist at LICCO Incorporated.

He began by telling us people always tell him that he must have patience to work with people with developmental disabilities, but he feels he has been privileged to do so for the past 31 years.

He explained how LICCO operates three employment programs. Sheltered employment at the LICCO facility in Heath allows workers to handle tasks such as packaging, basic assembly, bagging and sorting. LICCO arranges the work and pays based on work accomplished.

Gary Wimer, job developer for community employment services, works with supportive employment where clients work in local businesses with the support of an MRDD job coach who also works at the site. They routinely do work for Armor Source, Bayer Material Science, Denison University, THK Manufacturing and other locations.

In competitive employment, clients are directly hired by businesses knowing MRDD will provide a job coach as needed to assist with any training needs. The coach may spend very little time at the work site, but is always available to help if needed.
