President **Nelson McCray** opened the meeting and invited **Kerry Hamilton** to give the invocation and pledge. **Tom Slater** led the club through *Let Children in Town Come By* with what he labeled "a little bit of adjustment."

Student guests were invited to give remarks. Licking Heights' student Shawn Duprae remarked on behalf of himself and Holly Young. Resource Officer Jim Ramsey was also in attendance. Northridge students Kelli Bonnett and Mike Herbst spoke. They were accompanied by Superintendent John Shepard. Most notably, Kelli fined Pat Jeffries \$2 (and Pat paid it too!).

President Nelson noted that the next group of students will be with the Club in April.

Announcements:

President Nelson introduced Spencer Barker, President of the new Rotaract Club at COTC and OSU-Newark. Spencer reported he expects to file the charter so the club will be active by April.

President Nelson encouraged Rotarians to mark their attendance on the sign-in sheets and indicated **Tom Mullady** is reporting 56% attendance for the month of February. **Mel Ree** was welcomed back.

President Nelson indicated sign-ups of prospective attendees are being sought for the All-County Clubs Meeting on Wednesday, March 17 at Cherry Valley Lodge starting at 11:30 a.m. Rotarians are reminded there will be no regular meeting on March 16.

Jennifer Utrevis, in connection with March being Worldwide Literacy Month, spoke about the work of the Read With Me Committee. She recognized Newark Rotarians whom have been involved over the years and noted that \$500 was being spent by the Club to buy books as part of a reading encouragement effort. Rotarians were invited to become involved with the Committee. **President Nelson** presented Jennifer with a certificate in recognition of her work.

Sergeant-at-Arms:

Pat Jeffries humbly noted the students' speeches saw "cookies and the sergeant-at-arms" as the stand out things about Newark Rotary. He proceeded to fine **Jennifer Utrevis**, **Gary Baker**, **Laura Lewis**, all Rotarians failing to

wear their badges or pins, **Amy Matesich**, **Tony Adams**, **Doug Ute** (for guest Barb Quackenbush), **Cara Riddel**, and **Bernadette Collins**.

Pat auctioned off tickets donated by **President Nelson** for the March 26 performance of The New Christy Minstrels at the Midland Theater. The pair sold for \$60 to **Hugh Price**.

Program:

Gary Baker introduced the speaker, Ms. Kelly Igoe, to give remarks on investor education and securities fraud prevention. Igoe is an attorney with the Division of Securities of the Ohio Dept. of Commerce who indicated she was giving her 55th speech to a Rotary Club.

The speaker led off her program with a limerick that began, "Stan had a plan, 147 investors in hand." The rhyme referred to Stan Cox who was sent to prison for taking \$7.9 million from people over a six year period in an investment fraud case. Not one person from among the 147 investors called the Ohio Dept. of Commerce to check on Stan Cox and see if he was a licensed securities broker. He was not.

Ms. Igoe talked about the role the Division of Securities plays in fraud prevention. Her advice was to call the Division to check licenses and ask for "disclosures" on securities brokers/advisors. The Division licenses investment advisors and stock brokers while also monitoring securities. It can also give advice to people who are considering selling securities.

She praised the Licking County Prosecuting Attorney's for their help with prosecuting cases as the Division of Securities legal staff's role in enforcement does not include prosecution. She also said they can't help recover lost investments, give legal advice, or give stock tips.

Taking questions, Igoe revealed that her enforcement team had a role in the recent Tom Noe and BWC cases and that the Bernie Madoff fraud case caught many people in Ohio.

Piggybacking on a story about a Lockbourne, Ohio couple that lost their retirement nest egg to an unlicensed day trader, she warned, "People tend to trust people who seem to be smart."

Raffle: The raffle winner was **Scott Kennedy**.

President Nelson remarked that next week's program was the presentation of the Steering Committee. Its five teams are reporting back to members with recommendations formed out of last year's roundtables. The program is titled "The Future of Newark Rotary is in Your Hands."
