Rotary, led the pledge of allegiance

Past president **Tom Slater**, Newark, and **Trump Bradley**, Granville Rotary, led our songs, "My country Tis of Thee" and "God Bless America"

**Catherine Baird**, President Pataskala Rotary, and **Connie Hawk**, President Granville Rotary, introduced each club, presidents elect from each club and acknowledged visiting Rotarians

**Catherine Baird**, President Pataskala Rotary, also introduced the Outbound Youth Exchange students, Laura Beckerley, Kasey Slip and Maura Sharkey, all from Granville High School.

**Jeff Lawyer** introduced incoming District Governor, **Brent Rosenthal** (2011-2012) and incoming District Governor for 2013-14, **Bart Mahoney**, and all past District Governors were asked to stand.

**T.D. Griley**, Introduced our very special guest, **International President, Ray Klinginsmith**.

Ray is a retired attorney from Kirksville, Missouri, who served as general counsel and professor of business administration for Truman State University (formerly Northeast Missouri State University) for more than 20 years. From 2001 to 2004, he served as a county commissioner for Adair County as well as many other positions and awards of distinction throughout his career.

Ray has been a Rotarian since 1961. He has served Rotary as District Governor, Chair of the 1998 Council on Legislation in New Delhi, and Chair of the 2008 Los Angeles Convention Committee. Ray was a member of the RI Board of Directors from 1985 to 1987. He joined The Rotary Foundation Trustees in 2002, serving as Vice Chair in 2005-60, and was a member of the Future Vision Committee from 2005 to 2008. Ray is a Major Donor and a recipient of the Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award.

**Ray Klinginsmith** began his presentation with his theme song, "Cowboy Logic".



He discussed the Rotary International convention to be held this year in New Orleans as a "life changing event"

He shared that Rotary International is a highly respected organization. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation has contributed millions in matching funds to support Rotary's project of Polio eradication.

Rotary has now passed \$160 million in matching funds. It is not too late to contribute.

Small Pox is the only other disease eradicated.

**President Klinginsmith** shared statistics regarding polio in the two countries that presented the greatest difficult India and Nigeria:

- India: In 2009 there were 700 cases of polio, in 2010 only 41, and this year one case of polio.
- Nigeria: In 2009 there were 500 cases of polio, in 2010 only 21, and this year five cases of polio.

**President Klinginsmith** also shared his three priorities:

- Support and strengthen clubs
- Focus and increase humanitarian services (Rotarians have contributed \$1 billion to eradicate Polio).
- To enhance public image and awareness

**President Lawyer** closed the meeting

- Had Ray sign books for donation to local library.
- The Licking County Clubs donated \$200 to the Rotary Foundation
- Licking Country Club flags donated to Ray
- Shred-It Day – June 18, North 21<sup>st</sup> Street
- Volunteers for Comp Enterprise – June 7-9
