Last Week's Meeting

President **Nelson McCray** opened the meeting

Richard Reed led us in the invocation and pledge.

Three minute Talk: Rev. Charles Smith gave his three-minute talk. He was born in Virginia, he knew early on he was destined to be a minister and a Rotarian because he lives his life by the Four-Way Test. He spoke about Truth, be a truth seeker, read more than just one newspaper, listen to more than one talk radio or television show to acquire different view points. Seek the truth. Charles in looking forward to meeting each of us in Rotary.

Program:

Rotarian Susan Fryer introduced today's speaker: Rotarian Dave Hile, Licking Valley school district superintendent. He spoke about - The Licking County Children's Reading Foundation.

He started out by asking the question: Why do we need a reading foundation?

He himself has taught many subjects as a school teacher, but not reading; when it came to his own children he was not sure he was able to teach them properly to read.

He came across a book called: "The 90% Reading Goal" and followed up by the same authors with "Annual growth – Catch up Growth". These books made a profound impact on this thinking as it related to reading. It demonstrated a community in Kennewick, Washington, was able to achieve a high percentage of literacy rates, year after year.

Children learn to read from the kindergartner level thru the third grade and read to learn from fourth on. About 75 percent of children who are poor readers early on never catch up.

We can affect the lives of more students more deeply and longer if we teach them to read well by the third grade! Discipline problems, attendance, self esteem, and drop out problems extend for the most part with children with low reading abilities.

Low reading deficiencies extend to all household demographics; he stated a survey that showed 32% of students reading below grade level have parents who are college graduates.

Dave pointed out that in his school district 40 to 50% of the children do read on grade level. He emphasized we must prepare our children before Kindergarten to begin reading.

So, establishing a reading foundation is very important. Early literacy intervention practices accounts for 50% of their success.

The Vision of the Foundation is: 100% literacy. The mission is: promote reading to every child everyday. This will be promoted thru the saturation of ads with the message - read for 20 minutes every day. Get books into the homes and hands of every child.

Dave wants people outside this community to remember Licking County as the place where people read to there kids.

He thanked Newark Rotary for the \$500 grant from our Foundation, Ashley Wade for her leadership as board president, and Marcia Downes for opening up "The Works" to allow them to meet there and to store their donated books.
