Bio for new member Stephen F. Krempasky: Born in Cleveland, Steve is currently the Executive Director of the Historic Midland Theatre in downtown Newark. His background in theatre dates back to high school. He earned an undergraduate degree in Theatre with an art minor at West Liberty University, West Virginia, where he also designed stage scenery for several summer stock theatre companies. In 1979, he completed his Master of Fine Arts degree in Scenic Design at Wayne State University. Soon thereafter, he became the Managing/Artistic Director of the Billings Studio Theatre of Billings, MT. After producing, directing or designing more than 100 shows, he left Billings in 1988, to work as the Managing Director of the Oak Ridge Playhouse, Oak Ridge, Tenn. In 1990, he became the Executive Director of the Bijou Theatre Center in Knoxville, Tenn. As the manager of East Tennessee's oldest operating theatre, circa 1909, he worked with many local performing arts groups including Theatre Knoxville and the Tennessee Stage Company. He also presented over 200 musical and touring artists while employed there. He was Chairman of the annual Knoxville Jazz and Blues Festival 1990-1996. He won the 1996 Knoxville Theatre Coalition BEST SCENIC DESIGN AWARD for his design of "RUMORS" for Theatre Knoxville. In 1996, Steve became Vice President Theatre Operations for the brand new Whitaker Center for Science and the Arts in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. He helped build the facility and its programs guiding the award winning operation through its first 10 years. He and his wife, Mary are the proud parents of their 12 year old boy, Scotty, and his 10 year old sister, Anna. They live in Newark.
