Three Minute Talk: New member **Dave Froelich** feels his forty-one year marriage to the same woman as one of his most significant accomplishments. Dave and his wife have two adult children. One resides in Cincinnati and one in Cleveland. Dave is a proud Newark High School graduate. While attending college at Ohio State University Dave was recruited by the Saint Louis Cardinals and accepted a contract. Several years later the Cardinals realized Dave couldn't hit very well and he moved on. He spent six weeks in umpire school and enjoyed umpiring at various levels for several years. At one point he realized he was umpiring in the same league he played in as a youngster! Dave joined CNA Insurance Companies and spent most of his adult life working in the insurance industry, retiring as a marketing manager. Along the way he has thoroughly enjoyed coaching kids at baseball. He feels strongly that the community needs to find a way to preserve the Babe Ruth World Series in Newark.

Over the years the series has generated several million dollars in revenue for local hotel, motel and restaurant businesses. Dave complimented the efforts of Newark Rotary members **Dan DeLawder**, **Eschol Curl** and **Pat Jeffries** to lead community efforts to bring the series back to Newark in 2010.

Program: Program Committee Chair **Susan Fryer** introduced Melissa Ford, Senior District Executive for the Licking District of Simon Kenton Council, Boy Scouts of America. Melissa has been with the Simon Kenton Council since October of 2002. She is a graduate of Ohio State University and a former member of the Circleville noon rotary club. Melissa, her husband Shawn and son, Kallum, live in Lancaster.

Melissa began her program by recognizing club members with a scouting history and especially those with National awards. **John Weaver** and **Dan DeLawder** are both recipients of the very scarce Silver Beaver award. **Rick Battat, Jack Stickle, Dan DeLawder** and **Tim Fitterer** are all distinguished Eagle Scouts. Melissa recognized all previous scouts with a special pin.

The mission of Boy Scouts of America (BOA) is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the scout oath and law. Melissa drew comparisons between the mission and principles of BOA and the rotary 4-way test. On February 8, 2010, BOA will celebrate one hundred years of service to young people, culminating at the national Jamboree on July 10.

BOA still holds steadfast to its core principles of leadership, character, service, environmental stewardship and integrity. Scouting instills values that never go out of style and are good for a lifetime. The primary goal of scouting is to teach young people to always do the right thing, even when no one is watching. Service is very important to scouting. Young people grow by reaching out to others. The outdoors provides the backdrop for so much of what scouting teaches, including the importance of cherishing, protecting and preserving the environment. Well into the future, scouting will provide an important teaching experience to shape young boys and girls to assume their responsibilities as leaders, parents and neighbors.

Licking County boasts a total of 1,409 youth belonging to 58 different scouting units. The membership in our county shows small but predictable growth each year, which is better than national statistics. The Simon Kenton Council covers seventeen counties in Ohio and one county in Kentucky. There are twelve districts in the Council. Some districts are multi-county and some districts are made up of a single county. Our very own **Tim Fitterer** is currently District Chairman for the Licking District.
