Program

Susan Fryer introduced the speaker, Christy Eckstein, Executive Director of the Ohio Grape Industries Committee (OGIC). According to Christy, there are 147 wineries in Ohio. The economic impact of the Ohio winery business in 2008 was \$582 million and 4109 jobs, yet there were only 124 wineries at that time. She also pointed out that the recessed economic has driven alcohol sales up. In fact, her agency receives \$5 per gallon sold, which resulted in \$1.1 million in funding for fiscal year 2010.

The OGIC, begun in 1982 by the State of Ohio, uses its funds to provide marketing, research and education to Ohio's wine producers.

A focus of the OGIC is on quality assurance, and to that end, the agency has developed an Ohio Quality Wine Program. To qualify for this seal of approval, wines must be made with at least 90% Ohio-grown grapes. There are 125 wines that currently qualify.

However, if you are thinking about starting a winery, you will need a little cash. Start-up costs are estimated at \$10-\$20,000 per acre and it can take up to 5 years to yield a productive grape crop. Currently, there are only 1500 acres in Ohio being used to raise grapes for Ohio wineries. Much of the grape juice used by our state's winemakers is shipped in from other states.

Christy added that Ohio is becoming recognized nationally for its white wines. Red grapes are not as popular to produce since Ohio has a shorter growing season.
