## This week's Meeting: State Rep. Jay Hottinger, R-Newark



State Representative Jay Hottinger is back in the Ohio House of Representatives serving his third consecutive term where he serves as chairman of the Insurance Committee. He represents the 71<sup>st</sup> House District, which encompasses portions of Licking County.

Prior to his current tenure in the Ohio House, Representative Hottinger worked for the people of the 77<sup>th</sup> House District as well as the 31<sup>st</sup> Senate District. A life-long resident of Newark, he served on Newark City Council and was selected by his peers to serve as Newark's President Pro Tempore. He remains active in several community organizations, including his assistance in forming the Police Athletic League (PAL) of Licking County.

Hottinger has been recognized many times for his work in the Legislature. He is the recipient of numerous honors, such as Outstanding Young Man of Licking County, Kenneth J. Martin Award for excellence in contributions to political science, Watchdog of the Treasury Award, Friend of Ohio's Taxpayer, the Distinguished Alumni of Newark City Schools, Guardian of Small Business, Friend of Community Colleges and the Ohio Society of CPA's Outstanding Legislator Award.

Representative Hottinger attended Newark High School and graduated from Capital University, where he majored in political science and public administration. Though he is extremely active in both the Legislature and his local community, Representative Hottinger still places priority in his family. He and his wife, Cheri, reside in Newark and are the proud parents of their daughters: Savannah, Heather and Jayme.

## Program:

**Chris Meyer** introduced our speaker, Chris Evans who spoke to us about how American music during the times of war reflects and shapes the sentiments of the people. *Yankee-Doodle* during the American Revolution, *Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition* during World War 2, *The Ballad of the Green Beret* during the Vietnam War and today's *God Bless the U.S.A.* are some examples. In every one of those cases, you are looking at a microcosm of the public's attitude toward the war at that time.

That attitude can change as the war drags on. Music of the Civil War is a good example. In the beginning, The Battle Hymn of the Republic embraced the patriotism of the Northerners. Two years later, songs like *The Vacant Chair* and *Comrade I Am Dying* reflected a nation weary of the war. When the war was drawing to a close, songs like *Our boys are Coming Home* and *The Battle Cry of Freedom* became popular. *When Johnny Comes marching Home* was written during the Civil War but has been sung during every one of our wars.

The songs *Dixie* and a popular song named *Lorraine* were the two most popular songs of the Confederate soldiers and both were written in central Ohio. Dixie was played at Jefferson Davis' inauguration and was the defacto anthem of the South. One day after Lee's surrender, President Lincoln, while addressing a crowd said, "I propose that the band play Dixie, the best song I have ever heard."

Julia Ward Howe was in Washington D.C. and heard the troops marching in the streets singing John Brown's Body. That night, she awoke with the words to the *Battle Hymn of the Republic* in her mind. She quickly got up and wrote them down.

The drawing was won by **Dave Froelich** who donated it to the Historical Society.

**Foundation Annual Meeting:** After the weekly meeting was adjourned, the annual meeting of the Newark Rotary Foundation was brought to order with **Tom Slater** presiding. The minutes of the last meeting were approved and **Cheryl Snyder, Mike Massaro, Jon Spahr and Todd Ware** were elected to a one-year term. President **Gary Baker** and incoming president **Laura Lewis** will also serve on the board. Outgoing member **John Weaver** was recognized for his many years of service.
