Program:

Guest speaker the **Honorable Gregory L. Frost** was introduced by the **Honorable Tom Marcelain**. Judge Frost began his talk by wishing a very Happy Birthday to the recently retired and **Honorable Jon Spahr**.

Judge Frost, who is a Newark native, has served as judge of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio since 2003. He enlightened members with his program "Federal Courts 101". Judge Frost said most people are more familiar with the local court system, but have no idea about the federal courts. He described the federal docket as 18% criminal cases and 82% civil cases, unlike the local courts which see approximately 50% of each. His federal criminal cases mostly encompass drugs, guns, healthcare fraud, tax fraud and child pornography.

Judge Frost has also presided over a complex terrorism case. His civil cases have included job discrimination, patent law, false claim acts, copyright infringements, bankruptcy, personal injury, foreclosures and death sentence appeals. Judge Frost is currently on a committee to review the issue of cameras in the federal courtrooms. A quick quote from the judge: "Never underestimate the stupidity of a criminal."
