Program:

Chris Meyer introduced the speaker, **Jim Kiracofe**. Mr. Kiracofe is the Program Administrator for the Licking County Soil & Water Conservation District (LCSWCD) and has been in that position for more than 14 years. He is a graduate of OSU with a B.S. in Animal Science and an M.S. in Agricultural Economics. He is a lifelong farmer and he and his wife, Lynna, own and operate a 420 acre farm in Washington Township.

This District was created in 1944 by the state of Ohio to partner with state and federal agencies in order to assist land owners in conserving natural resources. In the early years, programs focused on helping farmers reduce excessive soil erosion. As the county's land use changed, additional programs were added and focused on protecting all natural resources.

Licking County is made up of 438,768 acres, 331 miles of rivers and streams and 109 different soil types. Agriculture is the number one industry in Licking County. In the past 60 years, crop production has increased fourfold but will need to increase another 70% by 2050. This clearly demonstrates the need to farm intensively but also responsibly. We must preserve today for our children tomorrow.

LCSWCD is governed by a five-member board of supervisors and is located at 771 East Main St. The main goals of the District are:

1. Management of soil
2. Education of landowners to enhance decision making
3. Decrease pollution of rivers and streams
4. Protection and restoration of environment
5. Education, outreach and work with partners
