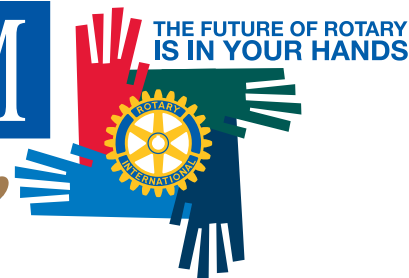

## Last Week's Meeting

President **Nelson McCray** opened the meeting and invited Tony Adams to give the invocation and pledge. **Tom Slater** led the club through two stanzas of "This is My Country" adding, in explanation for singing the first stanza twice, "Since I'm the leader, I can use whatever words I want."

President-elect **Jeff Lawyer** introduced Visiting Rotarians, Dr. Craig Cairns of the Newark-Heath club and Damon Kuhn of the Logan club. He also introduced guests Diane Paetz, guest of Fred Paetz; Debbie Kelley, guest of Steve Grissom; and Patty Morrice, guest of Bryce Morrice.

Student guests were also introduced. Host Rotarian **Stephen Fowler** introduced Watkins Memorial High School students Haley Gwilliams (yes, this is the proper spelling) and Mike Taylor. Host Rotarian **Tony Adams** introduced Lakewood High School counselor Phil Sikorski and students Nicole Kennedy and Brian Large.

## Announcements:

**President Nelson** President Nelson encouraged Rotarians to mark their attendance on the sign-in sheets.

**President Nelson** called attention to the members' e-mail that noted the Gallipolis club is soliciting help for the Philippines. Nelson encouraged members to consider donation by check to the tax-deductible arm of the Gallipolis club as the preferred way to donate versus trying to bring clothing and other items to Gallipolis.

A pirate, complete with shouldered parrot, took the podium to talk about the Oct. 31 Rotary Auction. Treasures at the auction include Mortricia (wait to see this) and a Cruise of Alaska or ski trip via the PNB Team. The pirate concluded saying, "Its mutiny not to attend."

**President Nelson** officially read off the names of proposed new members Dave Hile and Bernadette Collins.

**Sergeant-at-Arms: Bill Cost** served as Sergeant-at-arms for the **Pat Jeffries** who, according to Bill, called in sick with the "H-I-N-I" virus (pronounced hiney). Sergeant Bill gave **Dick Reed** the floor to announce the birth of Elizabeth Anne, his 10th grandchild at 6 lbs. 10 oz. Dick voluntarily put \$100 in the pot for his fine.

Sergeant Bill fined **Molly Ingold** for her son's name being in the paper as starting tackle at Ohio Northern (and another \$1 if she was learning this for the first time). **Glenn Abel** was fined for his interview with Channel 10 having served 52 years as an usher at Ohio Stadium. **Matt Calhoun, Rob Montagnese, Bob Barnes, Terry Hill,** and **Rick Platt** were also among the fined for the week.

**Bill** auctioned off **Erin Kennedy's** sequined

pumpkin with mums with Amy Matesich narrowly outbidding her husband Jim Matesich for the item at \$100.01.

## Program:

**Rob Montagnese** cautioned Rotarians to not spray into their mouths the miniature hand sanitizer containers provided by Licking Memorial at the tables today. He then introduced today's speaker, Dr. Alvin Jackson, Director of the Ohio Department of Health, to talk about H1N1 preparedness.

Dr. Jackson began his remarks noting the "wonderful and innovative" Licking Memorial Hospital which he toured before the meeting. He noted the Ohio Dept. of Health is a cabinet-level agency that partners with 131 local health departments around Ohio. On a \$650 million annual budget, it, among other things, regulates nursing homes, conducts prevention programming, leads emergency preparedness planning, and keeps vital records on birth, marriage, and death.

Regarding H1N1, the speaker's theme was "Success is going to involve every citizen." In the past 100 years, there have been three major pandemics, including the Spanish Flu that saw more than 1 million Ohio cases with 8,602 deaths in the state.

As of early this month, health agencies are seeing widespread flu activity, which is unusual for this time of year and attributed to the spread of H1N1 which was first detected in April 2009 and was named a pandemic in June. Observers are seeing the flu is becoming stronger and not showing signs of letting up.

He encouraged everyone to engage in frequent hand-washing and to practice "basic common sense" to prevent it, including using anti-virals to manage the symptoms and getting vaccinated. He also noted that Ohio, for its role, has purchased \$18 million worth of anti-virals for stockpile in case of a run on the commercial supply. The state has also ordered an initial 425,000 doses of the vaccine, of which Licking County health agencies have now received a mix of both nasal mist and injection varieties for the target population. He assured everyone that, eventually, all of the population will have access to the vaccine. He did not predict that Ohio would make vaccination mandatory as some other states have already.
